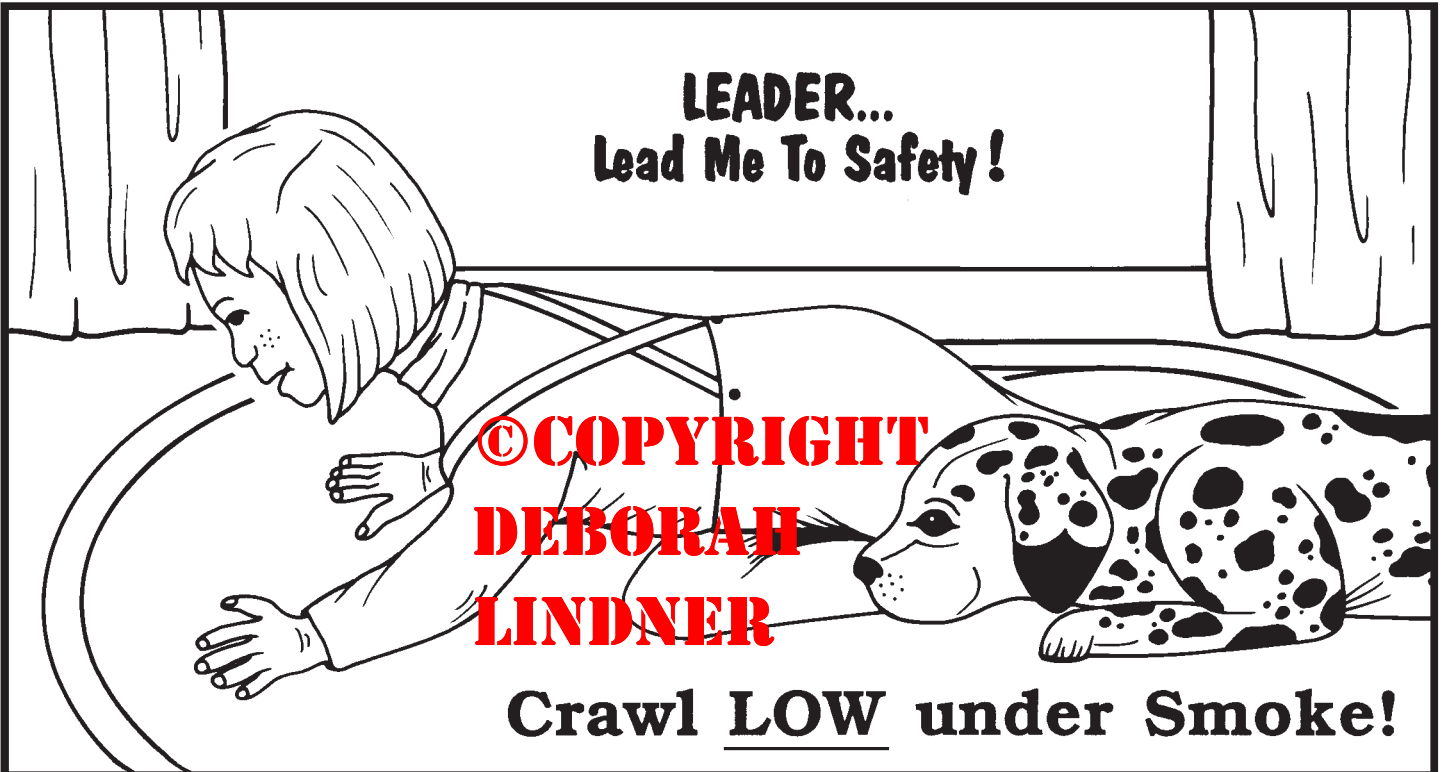

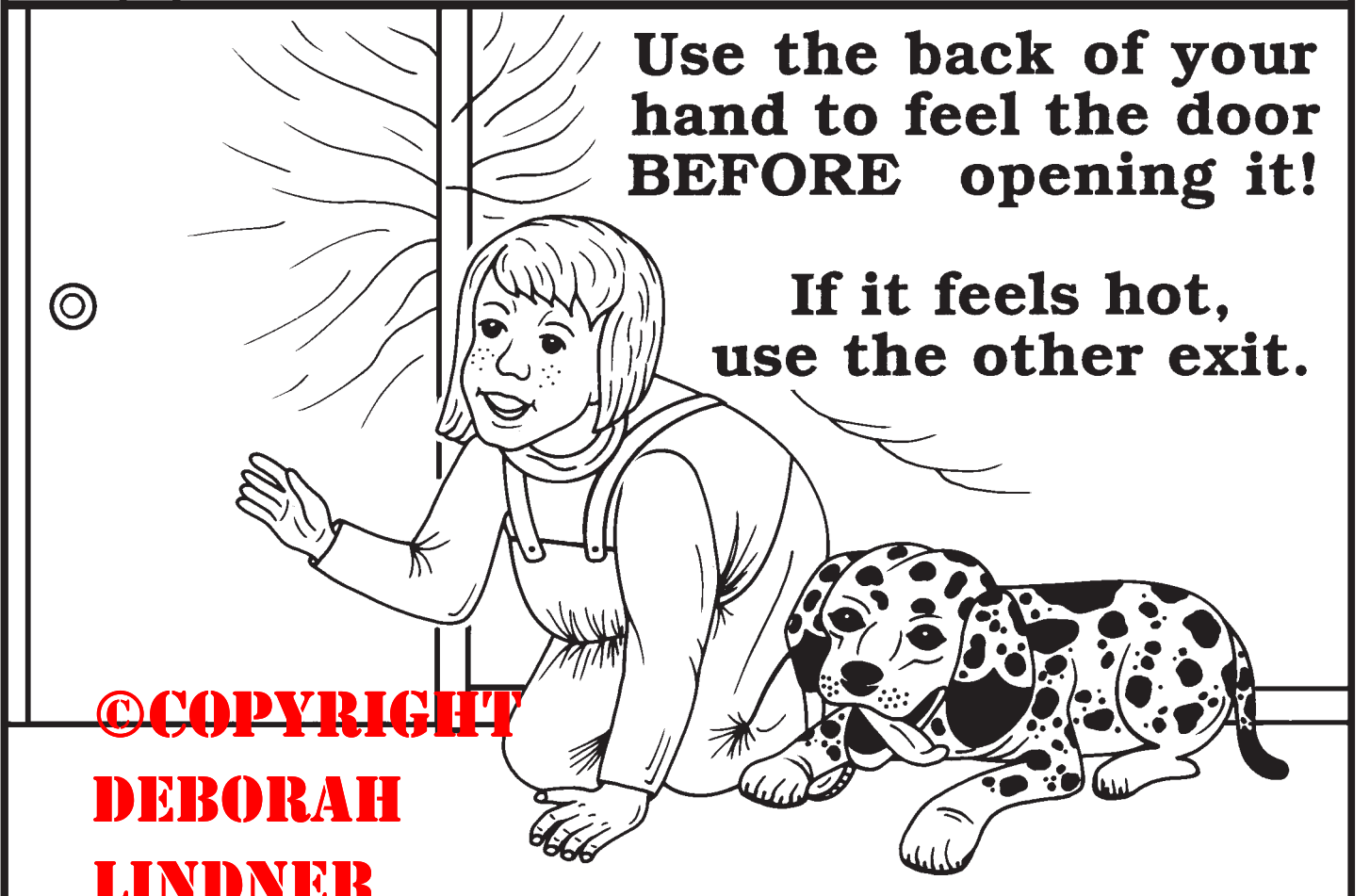

DON'T RUN!


DROP!

NEVER RUN IF YOUR CLOTHES CATCH ON FIRE!
If your clothes catch on fire... STOP... DON'T RUN! Running will fan the flames and make them worse! DROP to the floor! Then, ROLL over and over to help smother the flames. Better yet, if there's a towel, blanket or throw rug nearby, wrap it around you. Then roll around on the floor to put the flames out!

NEVER hide in the attic or basement.

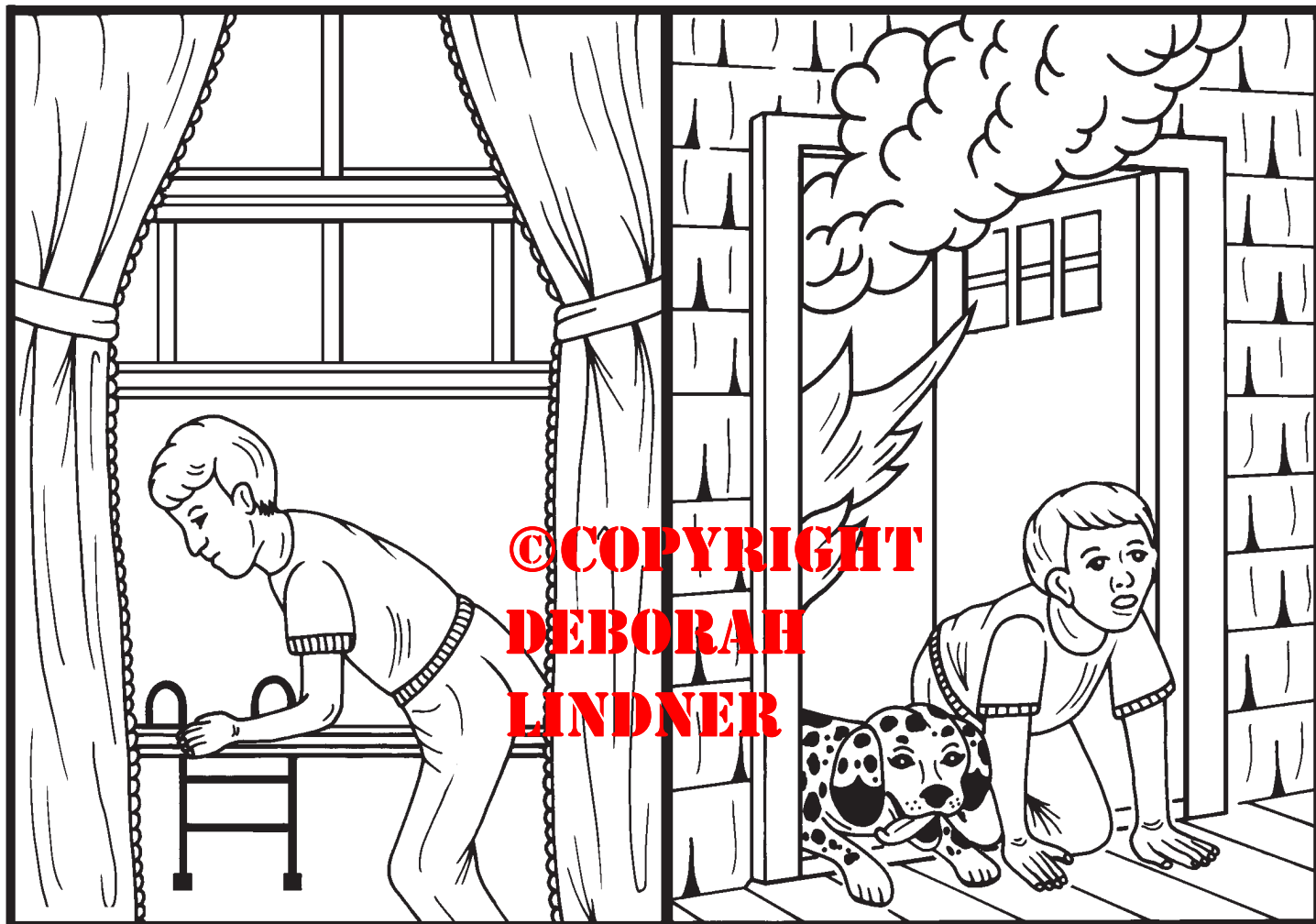
NEVER hide under your bed.

Don't worry about pets or toys.

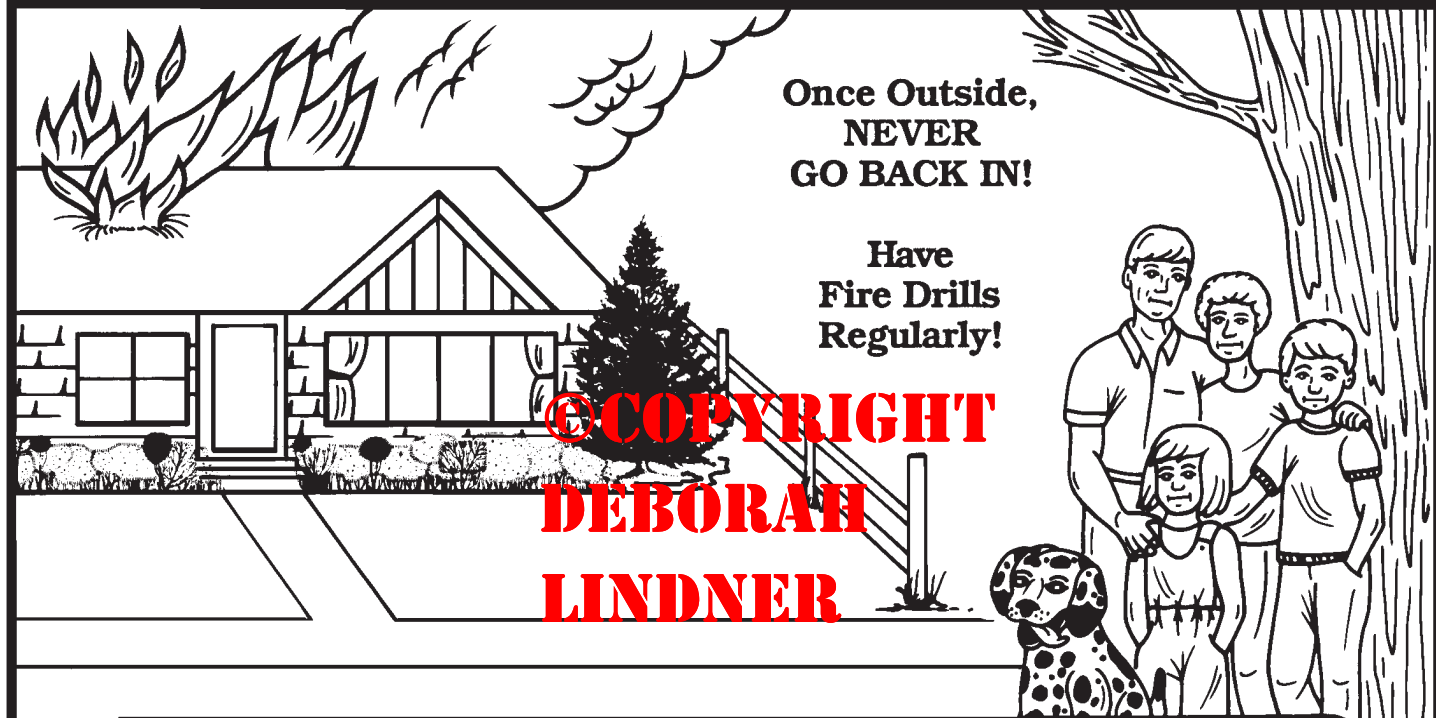
GET OUT SAFE!
