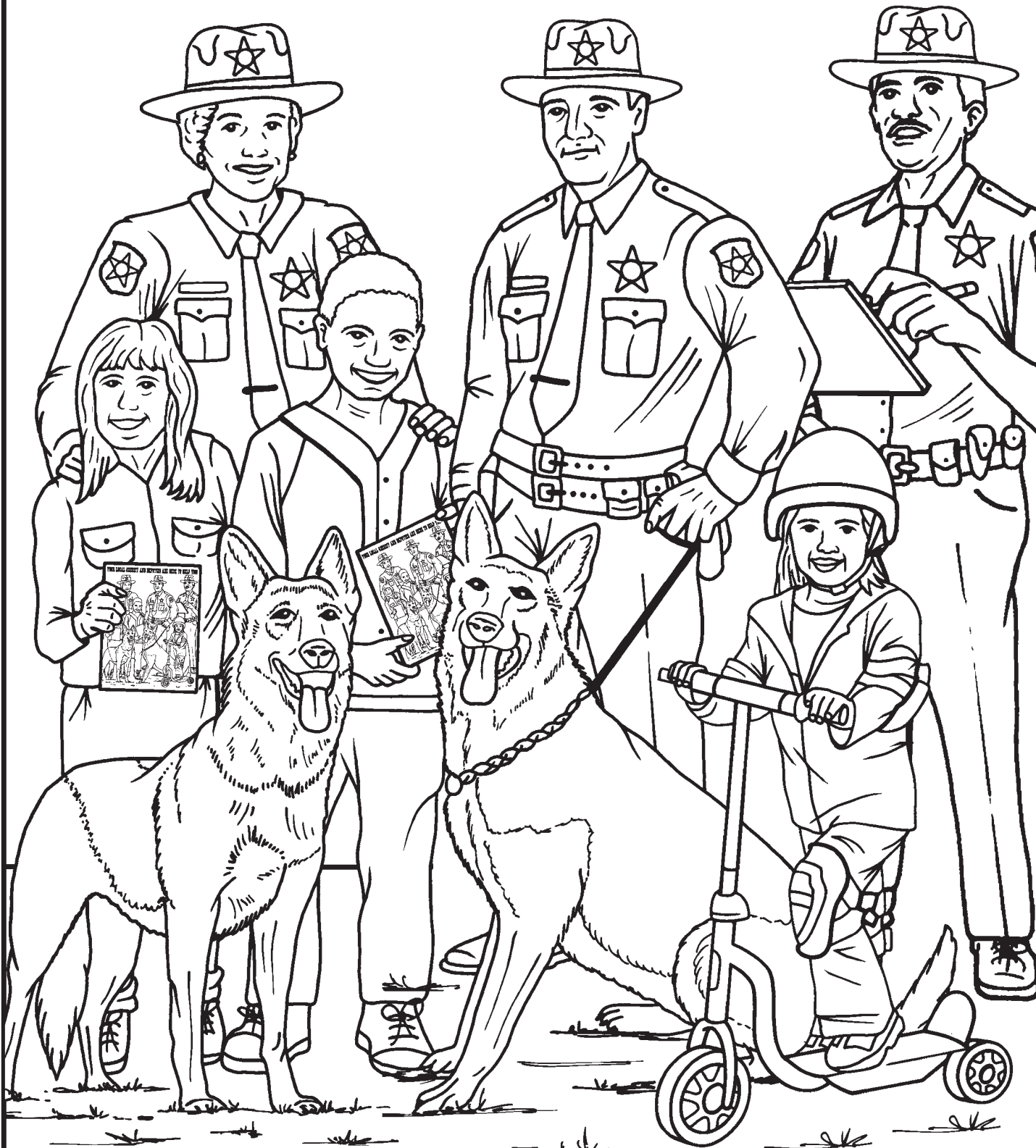

Sheriffs and Deputies are your friends. They patrol your neighborhood and are working everyday to make sure that you, your family and the members of your community are safe. The Sheriff and Deputies want to show you what they do and offer you some good advice to keep you safe! Have fun with the games! Read the pages with your parents. There is information for them too!

Here's how to DIAL: 911

Let your parents show you how to hold the phone.

- First touch the number 9.
- Then touch the number 1.
- Then touch the number 1 again.
- The Dispatcher will answer.
- Give the Dispatcher the information that they need to send help to you.

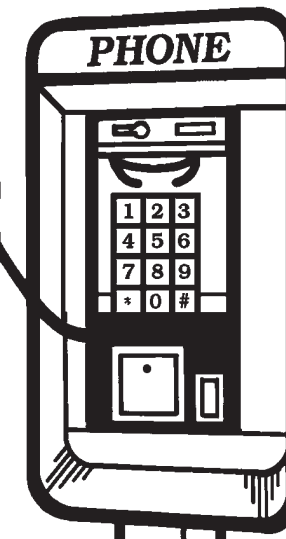
Stay Calm and Speak Clearly!

Do Not Hang Up Until the Dispatcher Tells You To!

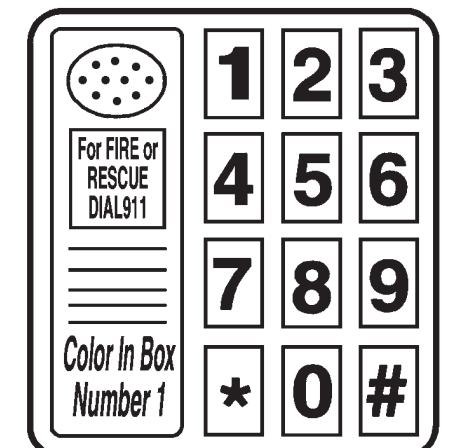
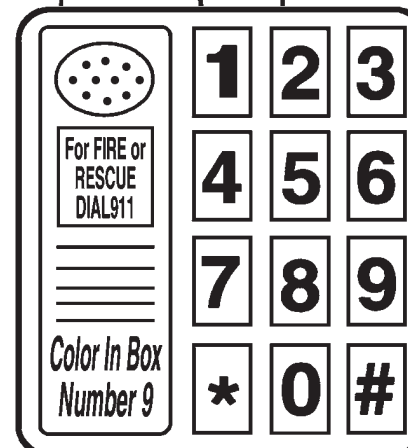

It is always best to use a land-line (cordless is OK) to make an emergency call to 9-1-1. This way, your address and phone number will automatically come up on the dispatcher's computer screen. However, you can also use your cell phone to DIAL: 9-1-1.

THE CALL TO 9-1-1 IS FREE ON A PAY PHONE

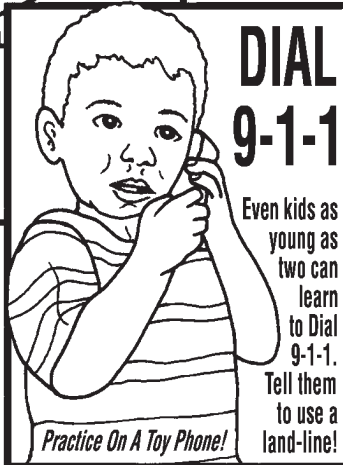
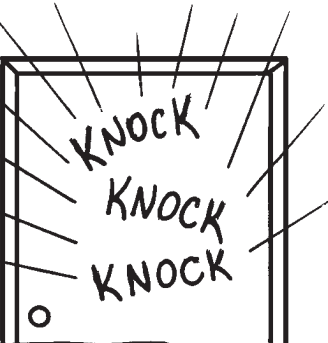

If you are home alone and are frightened by strange calls or a stranger knocking at your door, DIAL: 911! Don't open the door for anyone you don't know. *Wait for the Sheriff!*



DIAL 9-1-1

Even kids as young as two can learn to Dial 9-1-1. Tell them to use a land-line!
Practice On A Toy Phone!

If you think a child has swallowed medicine, cleaners or any other poison, DIAL: 911 right away! They will connect you to poison control and send an ambulance right away!



Put Your Toys Away!

Accidents Happen! If someone falls or injures themselves, DIAL: 911! Do not move them until help arrives.



If you are lost and need help, use your cell phone or a pay phone and DIAL: 9-1-1. You don't need any money! Wait for the Sheriff or a Deputy to come and take you home! NEVER go anywhere with a stranger!

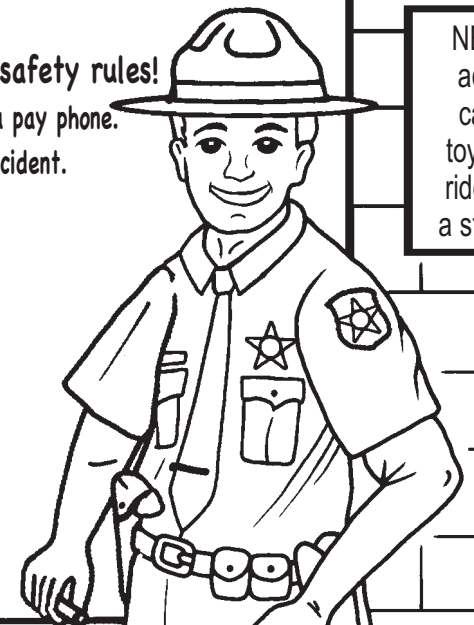
SAFETY RULES!

Sheriffs & Deputies are here to help you. Please learn these safety rules!

Learn to Dial 9-1-1 in an emergency. Use the home phone, your cell phone or a pay phone. Use it to call a Police Officer if you are lost or if someone is hurt or in an accident.

- RULE 1:** Always obey traffic rules, including lights and crossing guards.
- RULE 2:** Use the "buddy system" when you walk to school or play outside.
- RULE 3:** Always take the same route or bus to and from school every day.
- RULE 4:** Don't accept gifts, candy, or a ride from a stranger.
- RULE 5:** If someone offers you cigarettes, drugs or alcohol, Think DANGER: call 9-1-1 or tell a trusted adult.
- RULE 6:** Never touch or use a gun. Even if you think it might be fake, Don't Touch It! TELL AN ADULT RIGHT AWAY!
- RULE 7:** Learn your full name, address and phone number!

NEVER accept candy, toys or a ride from a stranger!



Learn your parents & other trusted adults phone numbers!

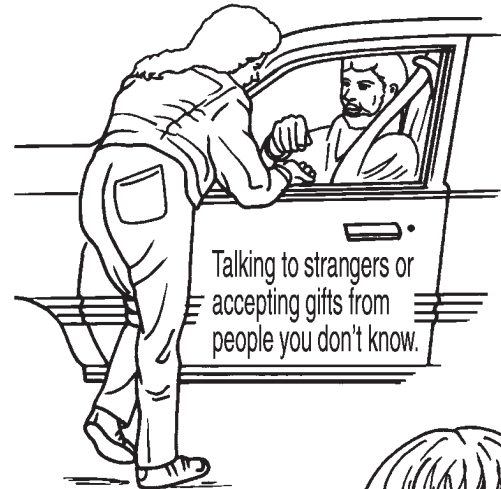

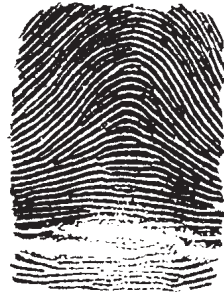
If you are lost or frightened, don't be afraid to speak to a Sheriff or Deputy. They are there to help you.

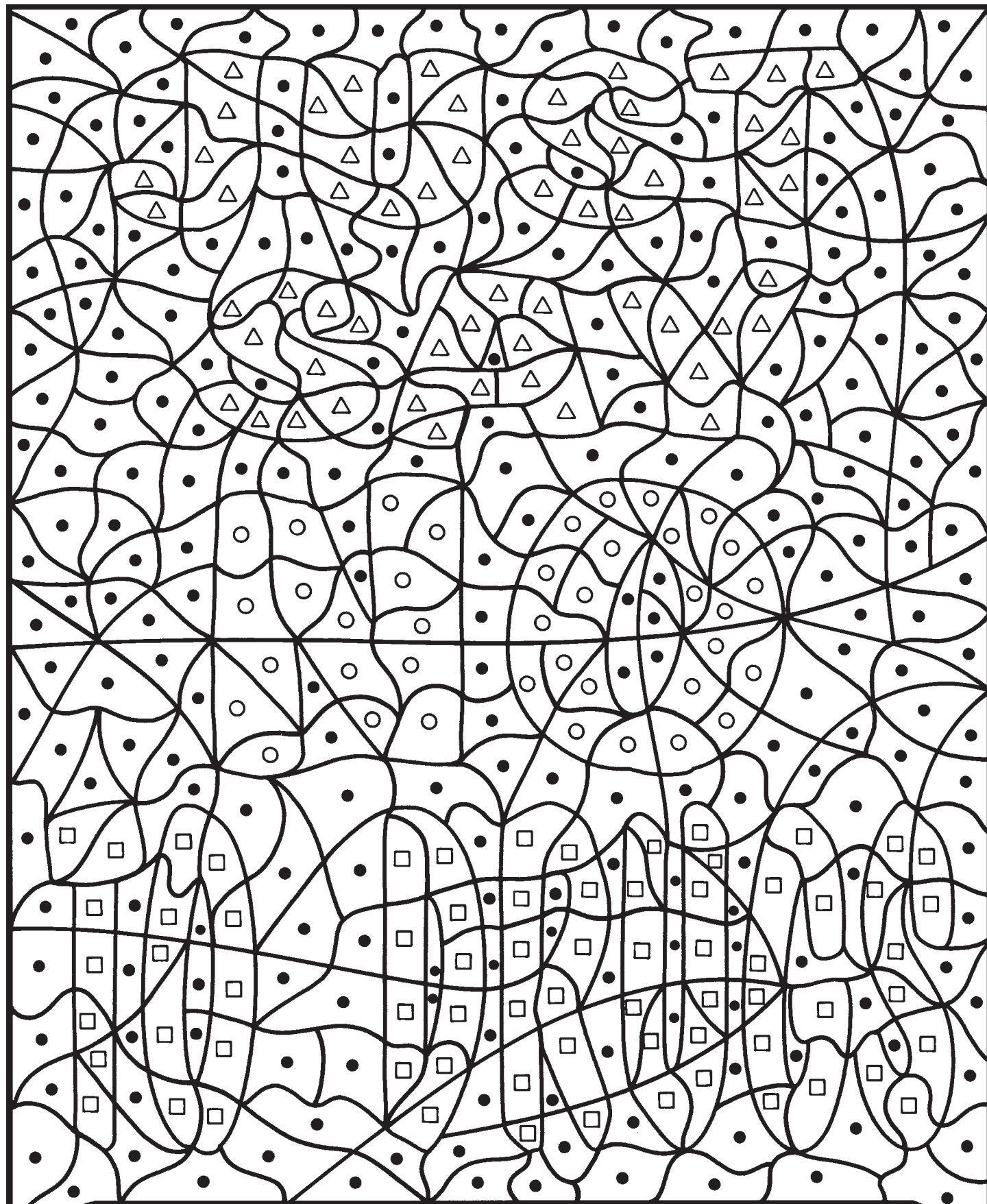

I promise to tell my parents, teacher or baby-sitter where I will be going and when I will be back.

I will always call my parents if there is a change in my plans or if I am going to be late.

I will never pick up a gun or touch firecrackers. I will tell my parents right away or Dial: 911

I will always take the same bus or walk down the same streets when going to and from school.

I will always try to be with a friend whenever I'm playing outside. There is safety in numbers.

I will never get into a car with a stranger. I will quickly get away and tell a trusted adult immediately.

I will obey traffic safety rules and only cross the street at an intersection when the sign says "walk".

I will never try to be cool by trying illegal drugs or by taking someone else's medicine.
